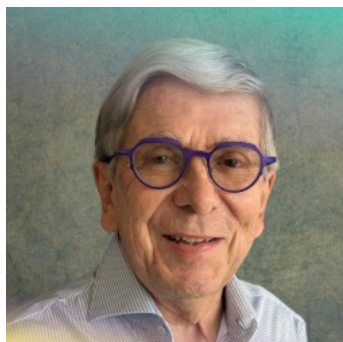

ROBIN COTTON

Born in England, Dr. Cotton received his medical degree from the University of Cambridge in 1965 and started his training in general surgery at the United Birmingham Hospitals in 1966. After spending three years in the health service in England, he traveled to Canada to undertake a research fellowship in general surgery at the University of Toronto, and subsequently completed his residency and fellowship in Otolaryngology at the University of Toronto. He then traveled to the U.S, where he completed a head and neck fellowship with Dr. Shumrick at the University of Cincinnati in 1973. After finishing his fellowship, Dr. Cotton led the Division of pediatric otolaryngology–head and neck surgery at Cincinnati Children’s Hospital Medical Center until 2012. He continued to practice surgery until 2019.

Dr. Cotton’s career has been dedicated to pediatric otolaryngology, and he has continuously aimed to raise the standard of care for children. He pioneered the techniques utilized worldwide in the reconstruction of the larynx and trachea in children with laryngotracheal stenosis. This led to a practice paradigm shift in treatment of airway problems in children, with the development of the multidisciplinary Aerodigestive and Esophageal Center in 1999. This has become a worldwide model for other Childrens’ hospitals.

Dr. Cotton is regarded amongst the premier pediatric otolaryngologists of his era and has trained many of the leading pediatric otolaryngologists in the U.S. and abroad. He has published extensively and lectured throughout the world.

He was on the editorial board of several journals and was a prolific contributor to the literature, having written more than 250 articles and books.

Dr. Cotton was a member of more than 20 national and international otolaryngology organizations, including the American Academy of Otolaryngology. He has served as President of the American Bronchoesophagological Association, the American Society of Pediatric Otolaryngology, and the Society for Ear, Nose, and Throat Advances in Children. He has received many honors and awards. The two awards he is most proud of are the prestigious Jacobson award from the American College of Surgeons and the Mosher Award from the Triologic Society. He was the first Otolaryngologist and only the 2nd pediatric surgeon to receive the Jacobson award, which is presented for innovative techniques in surgery.

Dr. Cotton retired in September 2019 and is thoroughly enjoying this phase of life. He has had the opportunity to revisit many of his hobbies, including travelling, bird watching, piano playing and his love of nature. He has taken an online course from The Ohio State University to become an Ohio Nature Guide, under the auspices of the Cincinnati Nature Center. This has led to the development of new friendships, an important part of retirement.

He has maintained his fitness and spent more time with his family locally and his wife Cindi. Joining a book club has enlarged his horizons of American literature, history and politics. He visits his out of town son, daughters and grandchildren, and travels home to Cornwall in England for several weeks a year. After initial hiccup due to Covid, retirement now feels back on track.

Da Hee Kim, MD, is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Otorhinolaryngology–Head and Neck Surgery at Yonsei University College of Medicine in Seoul, South Korea. She completed her medical degree, internship, and residency at Yonsei University’s Severance Hospital, where she also pursued a clinical fellowship in Head and Neck Surgery.

Dr. Kim is board-certified in Otolaryngology–Head and Neck Surgery and has engaged in international clinical training, including a subinternship at the University of California, San Francisco, and an exchange residency program at Kyoto University in Japan. These experiences have supported her development as a clinician with a global perspective on head and neck care.

In addition to her clinical work, Dr. Kim has contributed to research through her involvement with the Translational Genome Informatics Laboratory at Yonsei University. Her academic career has steadily advanced at Yonsei University, where she served as a Clinical Assistant Professor before assuming her current role as Assistant Professor in 2026.

Dr. Kim’s work focuses on advancing the diagnosis and treatment of head and neck conditions through both clinical practice and research. She remains actively engaged in academic medicine, contributing to education, patient care, and ongoing developments in her field.

Lauren D. Holinger Professor of Pediatric Otolaryngology, Northwestern Feinberg School of Medicine

Dr. Thompson serves as the Lauren D. Holinger Professor and Division Head of Pediatric Otolaryngology at Lurie Children’s Hospital of Chicago and Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine. She previously served as the Vice Chair for the Department of Surgery and the Executive Physician Director for Ambulatory Practice. She has 26 years of clinical care and leadership experience at three uniquely different top-tier matrixed academic institutions, including the Mayo Clinic and Cincinnati Children’s Hospital. She has a diverse portfolio which includes the development of service lines, multidisciplinary programs and interprofessional care models from inception to growth and sustainability phases, including strategic, operational, and fiduciary oversight. She is a visionary leader with a strong commitment to the creation of patient-centric value-based care delivery models for equitable access and fiscally responsible health care delivery in partnership with providers, patients, and community outreach.

She received undergraduate and medical degrees in the six-year BA/MD program at the University of Missouri–Kansas City. She completed a master’s degree in otolaryngology clinical outcomes research at the Mayo Graduate School of Medicine, the certificate program for emerging leaders at the Mayo Clinic, and an MBA from National Louis University.

Dr. Thompson brings 26 years of experience as an internationally recognized airway surgeon and leader in aerodigestive medicine.

Her collective research contributions in laryngomalacia have influenced the surgical and medical management of the disease and she is considered one of the world's authorities on the topic. She has published over 100 scientific articles and 20 book chapters. She has delivered over 350 presentations in areas of clinical and scientific research, practice development, leadership, health equity, physician burn out and well-being and to local, regional, national, and international audiences.

Dr. Thompson is a member of several academic otolaryngology societies and is recognized as a leader in Otolaryngology. She was the 2013 Helen F. Krause, MD Trailblazer award from the AAO-HNS and the 2015 Gabriel Tucker awardee from the ALA for outstanding career contributions to pediatric laryngology. She was the 2018 Ogura Lecturer and Guest of Honor for the Triological Society. She delivered the AAO-HNS 2019 John Conley lecture in Medical Ethics. Serving as President of the ABEA during the centennial year celebration, she was also recognized as the first black president of a major society in Otolaryngology. In 2024, she was inducted into the Hall of Distinction – and received the Living Legends Award, from the American Academy of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery. In 2011, she achieved the academic rank of Professor, making her the first African-American woman professor in the specialty of Otolaryngology Head and Neck Surgery in the United States. Her lived experience as a 3rd generation African-American physician has shaped a personal mission to lead change through redefining value in healthcare, by aligning quality, equity, and purpose.
