This year's annual ASPO meeting during COSM in Chicago, May 2024 was a great success. We had 3 plenary speakers, including Dr. Bruce Scott (first otolaryngologist to be president-elect of the AMA), Dr. Kenny Chan, and Dr. AJ Tompkins.
